## Statement by The Netherlands and Sweden

The Netherlands and Sweden cannot concur with the draft reply to the request for additional observations of the Council as regards the inquiry of the European Ombudsman into complaint 360/2021/TE that disclosure of the documents concerned would seriously undermine the ongoing decision-making process. Considering the restrictive interpretation of this exception by the Court regarding documents that relate to legislative procedures (De Capitani case, T-540/15), The Netherlands and Sweden believe that it is not sufficiently motivated that there is an actual and concrete risk that full disclosure would seriously undermine the institution's ongoing decision-making process and this risk is reasonably foreseeable and not only hypothetical. Furthermore, The Netherlands and Sweden believe there is an overriding public interest in disclosure considering the subject-matter of the documents involved and the criticism which the Council has received on this matter in the past.
