The Danish Parliament (Folketinget) has assessed the Commission's proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on a Single Market for Digital Services and studied whether it adheres to the Principle of Subsidiarity.

It is the assessment of the Folketing that the proposals do not breach the Principle of Subsidiarity.

A majority in the Folketing representing the Social Democratic Party, the Liberal Party of Denmark and the Unity List, consider it important that the persons charged with processing and making decisions in cases of complaint and extrajudicial disputes also possess adequate competences and knowledge, including an awareness of the national and European context pertinent to the case in question. For example, there may be significant cultural disparities between the countries with regard to what is considered "offensive".
