### a) Regulation on CAP Strategic Plans

The SCA took note of the information provided by the Presidency on the outcome of the last trilogue held on 30 April on the basis of the four-column document set out in document 8414/21 + ADD1, and of the comments from delegations and the Commission.

The discussion focused on the green architecture, certain aspects of rural development, the CAP's social dimension on the basis of a European Parliament non-paper set out in 8207/21, capping/degressivity/redistributive payments as well as climate and biodiversity tracking.

The Presidency will take into account the outcome of this meeting for the continuation of the negotiations with the European Parliament.

The SCA also took note of the information provided by Belgium on the transfer of multiannual commitments going beyond the current programming period to eco-schemes, as set out in document 8480/21, of the support from many other delegations and of the response from the Commission.

**b) Regulation on financing, management and monitoring of the CAP**

On the basis of the information provided on the state of play with the Horizontal Regulation, the Presidency invited delegations to provide written comments on the issue of the agricultural reserve, which is the main outstanding political issue in the negotiations.

**c) Regulation on common market organisation (CMO) of agricultural products**

The SCA took note of the information presented by the Presidency on the outcome of the 6th CMO trilogue on 29 April. The Presidency took note of the comments from delegations and the Commission and will take them into account in the ongoing negotiations.

The Presidency presented the SCA items foreseen for the "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council meeting to be held on 26-27 May 2021.

The SCA took note of the information provided by the Presidency regarding the setting of that "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council meeting's agenda.

The Polish delegation asked for an item to be tabled at that Council meeting, under "Any other business", on the Joint Declaration of the Ministers of Agriculture of the Visegrad Group (Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia) and Bulgaria, Croatia and Romania on the opportunities and challenges for farmers stemming from the Farm to Fork strategy.

The Presidency informed the SCA about the next SCA meeting on 17 May, on the next "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council meeting to be held on 26-27 May 2021 and on the informal meeting of the Ministers of Agriculture that will be held in Lisbon in June.

The Polish delegation asked for an item to be tabled at the next SCA meeting, under "Any other business", requesting the Commission to inform on the investments and reforms as well as financial envelopes dedicated to rural development and agri-food sector as proposed by the Member States in the National Recovery Plans already submitted to the Commission.
