#### I. **VOTE**

On 18 May 2021, the President of the European Parliament declared the Council's position<sup>1</sup> at first reading approved without amendments.

The text of the European Parliament's legislative resolution is annexed to this note.

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# II. ADOPTION OF LEGISLATIVE ACTS FOLLOWING THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT'S SECOND READING

Since the European Parliament has approved the Council's position at first reading without amendments, the act in question is deemed to have been adopted in the wording which corresponds to the Council's position at first reading, as provided for in Article 294(7)(a) of the TFEU.

After signature by the President of the European Parliament, the President of the Council and the Secretaries-General of the two Institutions, the act will be published in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

European Parliament legislative resolution of 18 May 2021 on the Council position at first reading with a view to the adoption of a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing the European Solidarity Corps Programme and repealing Regulations (EU) 2018/1475 and (EU) No 375/2014 (14153/1/2020 – C9-0143/2021 – 2018/0230(COD))

### (Ordinary legislative procedure: second reading)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Council position at first reading (14153/1/2020 C9-0143/2021),
- having regard to the opinion of the European Economic and Social Committee of 17 October 2018<sup>2</sup>,
- having regard to the opinion of the Committee of the Regions of 6 December 2018<sup>3</sup>,
- having regard to its position at first reading<sup>4</sup> on the Commission proposal to Parliament and the Council (COM(2018)0440),
- having regard to Article 294(7) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,
- having regard to the provisional agreement approved by the committee responsible under Rule
   74(4) of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to Rule 67 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the recommendation for second reading of the Committee on Culture and Education (A9-0156/2021),
- 1. Approves the Council position at first reading;
- 2. Takes note of the Commission statement annexed to this resolution;

- 3. Notes that the act is adopted in accordance with the Council position;
- 4. Instructs its President to sign the act with the President of the Council, in accordance with Article 297(1) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union;
- 5. Instructs its Secretary-General to sign the act, once it has been verified that all the procedures have been duly completed, and, in agreement with the Secretary-General of the Council, to arrange for its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*;
- 6. Instructs its President to forward its position to the Council, the Commission and the national parliaments.
