Subject: Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) .../... of 23.6.2021 supplementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2144 of the European Parliament and of the Council by laying down detailed rules concerning the specific test procedures and technical requirements for the type-approval of motor vehicles with regard to their intelligent speed assistance systems and for the type-approval of those systems as separate technical units and amending Annex II to that Regulation
- Intention not to raise objections

1. On 25 June 2021, the Commission submitted the above draft Delegated Regulation to the Council in accordance with Articles 4(6) and 6(6) of Regulation (EU) 2019/2144¹.
On 14 July 2021, the European Parliament asked for two months extension of the scrutiny period with a deadline until 24 October 2021.

2. Regulation (EU) 2019/2144 mandates motor vehicles of categories M and N to be equipped with Intelligent Speed Assistance (ISA) systems from 6 July 2022 for new vehicle types and from 7 July 2024 for all new vehicles. ISA prompts and encourages drivers to slow down when they are over the speed limit. The system works with the driver as an assisting function and it is an effective safety measure. The above Delegated Regulation supplements Regulation (EU) 2019/2144 by laying down the respective technical requirements and test procedures.
3. Delegations had until 3 September 2021 to object to the delegated act. By this deadline, no delegation has raised any objections or made any comments.
4. Against this background, the Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to recommend to the Council to confirm the non-opposition to the draft Delegated Regulation, as set out in document ST 10309/21 + ADD 1 to 7 as an item without discussion at one of its forthcoming meetings.
