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The conflict in Tigray has taken a dramatic turn in the last few weeks with the parties to the conflict launching new offensives. On 28 June, Tigrayan Defense Forces (TDF) took Tigray's capital Mekelle after the departure of the interim administration and the Ethiopian National Defense Forces (ENDF). Since July, the military confrontation between the TDF and the ENDF supported by Amhara militias and other armed groups has been spreading to the neighbouring regions (Afar and Amhara). Local actors state that the conflict in Amhara and Afar has displaced between 300 000 and 1 000 000 more people. With the recent involvement of Turkey and Iran, the conflict is likely to intensify in the coming weeks.

Close to ten months into the conflict, violence against civilians including brutal and widespread rape, as well as the systematic and deliberate destruction of basic services, water systems, crops, and livelihoods has created a massive protection and food security crisis. Approximately 91% of the region's population, i.e. 5,5 million people, are now in need of emergency assistance, including an estimated 2 million displaced people, while needs are increasing as the conflict spreads to neighbouring regions. Even more worryingly, famine is looming for an estimated 400 000 to 900 000 people according to analyses, and another one million is one-step below famine.

The Tigray region is still largely under a de facto humanitarian blockade. Overland access into Tigray now depends on a single route, through the Afar region, which involves passing through numerous checkpoints in a context of active hostilities. Humanitarian organisations require roughly 100 trucks worth of assistance and supplies to reach Mekelle every day. To provide access to Tigray, the EU is organising a Humanitarian Air Bridge, which was authorised by the Government of Ethiopia in late August. The first flight is scheduled on 8 September. This Air Bridge is essential to end the de facto blockage of Tigray by opening access by air and eventually by road; it will help position key commodities as soon as possible and to rapidly scale up access to the most immediate life-saving services.

According to the northern Ethiopia response plan (issued by United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs on 9 June), the requirements are EUR 723 million (May-December 2021). This response plan is facing a funding gap of EUR 366,6 million until the end of the year (May-December 2021). In addition, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations has urgently appealed for an additional EUR 25,4 million to reach nearly 1,2 million of the most food insecure people in northern Ethiopia. To date, only EUR 6,2 million have been pledged for this purpose.

d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

According to article 9 of the Multiannual Financial Framework Regulation, the Solidarity and Emergency Aid Reserve (SEAR) is intended to allow for

- (a) assistance to respond to emergency situations resulting from major disasters that are covered by the European Union Solidarity Fund, the objectives and scope of which are set out in Council Regulation (EC) No 2012/2002; and
- (b) rapid responses to specific emergency needs within the Union or in third countries following events which could not be foreseen when the budget was established, in particular for emergency responses and support operations following natural disasters not covered by point (a), man-made disasters, humanitarian crises in cases of large-scale public health, veterinary or phytosanitary threats, as well as in situations of particular pressure at the Union's external borders resulting from migratory flows, where circumstances so require.

d) Detailed grounds for the increase

EUR 30 million in commitment and in payment appropriations is requested in addition to the EUR 18 million already programmed for this crisis for 2021. Additional funding will be used for the provision of multi-sectoral response including health services and food to previously inaccessible areas within Tigray, who have been cut from external assistance since November 2020.

As of the end of August 2021, the overall implementation rate of commitment appropriations of the humanitarian aid chapter 14 03 was at 92,3% of available appropriations and the implementation in payment appropriations was at 80%. Following the call for an emergency response in Afghanistan, for which significant redeployment was achieved in Heading 6, the Commission has not been able to identify any further available resources in Heading 6. Therefore, it requests the mobilisation of the Solidarity and Emergency Aid Reserve for a total of EUR 30 million in commitment and in payment appropriations for the crisis in the Tigray region.
