¹ To qualify as a reasoned opinion as defined in Protocol No 2, an opinion must state why the national Parliament considers that a legislative proposal does not comply with the principle of subsidiarity and be sent to the Commission generally within eight weeks of the transmission of the legislative proposal to national Parliaments in all official languages.

² Under Protocol No 2, each national Parliament has two votes; in the case of a bicameral system, each chamber has one vote. Where reasoned opinions represent at least a third (for proposals under Article 76 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, a quarter) of all votes allocated to the national Parliaments, the so-called "yellow card" threshold is reached and the draft legislative act must be reviewed. Since the withdrawal of the United Kingdom, 18 out of 54 votes represent a third of all votes allocated. Moreover, the Commission has committed to produce aggregate responses to reasoned opinions issued by national Parliaments representing seven or more votes.
