Statement by the Commission

"The Commission confirms that exceeding the NDICI indicative target of 10% dedicated to migration-related actions would not result in the inability of the program to provide further resources. This is due to the fact that 10% is an indicative target and not a specific allocation, and that there is no 'cap' on migration related expenditure in the NDICI. It is indeed the case that by the end of the MFF the migration expenditure could be above the indicative 10% target.

The Commission confirms that DAB 5/2021, while using the full unallocated margin in Heading 6, will not have a negative impact on financing for other migration routes – which will be financed in particular through the NDICI-Global Europe. In the same vein, and in line with the Conclusions adopted by the European Council of 24th and 25th June 2021, the Commission confirms that the 2020-2023 refugees' package set out in the recent non-paper will not have a negative impact on the financing for the needs of all migration routes programmed under the operational lines of the NDICI Global Europe."

Joint statement by Austria, Greece and Cyprus

"In order not to jeopardise the update of the list as a whole and to recognise the positive developments in many third countries, Austria, Cyprus and Greece accept the proposed Council conclusions.

Swift and noticeable progress is expected from Turkey, which will be ensured by a regular monitoring of the technical progress concerning the effective exchange of financial account information.

Accordingly, the deadline to solve outstanding technical issues to effectively exchange data as soon as possible, but no later than 31 December 2021 will be closely observed.

Austria, Cyprus and Greece expect that Turkey will carry out the effective exchange of financial account information for fiscal years 2020 and onwards with all Member States in accordance with the CRS, and in this way will comply with its obligation, as laid down in the CRS, to exchange financial account information with all interested appropriate partners."

### Statement by Austria

"Austria welcomes that the compromise achieved allows to maintain national schemes for qualified migration parallel to the Blue Card. The Austrian "Red-White-Red" card is an effective instrument of the Austrian migration law which allows to manage qualified migration effectively and which can be flexibly adapted to the needs of the labor market. Furthermore, Austria welcomes that the scope of the Blue Card has not been extended to applicants for international protection. However, concerns remain that the Blue Card does not clearly distinguish between migration of persons in need of protection and labor migration. Without such a distinction misleading signals are sent.

Austria could have supported the inclusion of beneficiaries of international protection into the scope of the Blue Card under specific conditions, as set out in the Council mandate of 26 July 2017, in order to mitigate incentives for secondary movements.

Concerning the provisions related to acquiring long-term residence status, Austria welcomes that the long-term residence status can be acquired after 5 years of legal residence, as set out in the Long-Term Residents Directive (2003/109/EC), instead of 3 years as foreseen in the original Blue Card proposal by the Commission.

Moreover, concerns remain regarding the shortened 30-day procedural deadline in the cases of intra-EU mobility.

Finally, with regard to equal treatment, Austria supports the inclusion of the provision of the Council mandate laying down that Member States may restrict equal treatment of third-country nationals as regards family benefits in relation to family members who reside in a third country. Unfortunately, this is not reflected in the final text.

Against this backdrop, Austria abstains."

### Statement by Hungary

"Hungary would like to emphasize its appreciation to the Presidency's efforts to preserve the core elements of the general approach, however, there are still elements in the proposal that are not in line with our position, especially concerning the protection of the labour market. Hungary opposes any restriction on the application of labour market test beyond the provisions currently in force. We also oppose increasing the minimum period of validity of the Blue Card. Furthermore we would like to stress our strong position according to which Hungary does not consider either necessary or appropriate the further harmonisation of the relevant rules in the field of legal migration, and in this regard we would like to reiterate our position on legal migration in general.

We acknowledge that the reached compromise is the result of long lasting negotiations, however Hungary is not in a position to accept the final compromise, due to the aforementioned reasons."

Statement by the Commission

"The Commission considers that Union submissions to be sent to the IMO are covered by EU exclusive competence. Submission of proposals to the IMO on issues of EU competence is an act of external representation, which, in accordance with Article 17(1) TEU, is the institutional prerogative of the Commission.  
In the Commission's view, the procedural arguments against presenting submissions to the IMO by the Commission on behalf of the EU are not convincing. This is because there is no evidence to suggest that the IMO, as a specialised agency of the United Nations, would be in a position to reject such a submission.  
The Treaty provisions on external representation of the Union must be applied. It should therefore be made by the European Commission on behalf of the European Union and sent to the IMO by the Commission.  
The Commission reserves all its rights in this regard."

#### **Statement by the Commission**

related to the determination of the legal basis for the future agreement between the EU and the UK on Gibraltar

"The Commission considers it legally incorrect that a Council Decision authorising the opening of negotiations indicates a substantive legal basis. The Decision authorising the opening of negotiations is premised solely on the existence of conferred powers of the Union and not on a determination of a specific competence. Its effect is limited to authorising the Commission in the present case, to use its prerogatives under the EU Treaties in order to start negotiations. The scope of these negotiations is therefore determined by the scope of the powers of the Union. Besides, the freedom of the envisaged treaty partner of the Union as regards the determination of the scope of the negotiations cannot be limited by the Council Decision authorising the opening of the negotiations. Thus, the precise legal basis for the future agreement can only be determined after the content of the agreement is known. The Commission reserves all its rights in this regard."

### Statement by the Commission

related to the procedural arrangements for the conduct of the negotiations

"While Article 3 of the draft Council Decision provides for negotiations to be conducted in consultation with a special committee (which is in line with Article 218(4) TFEU), points 69 and 70 of the negotiating directives in the addendum to the draft Council Decision foresee different procedural arrangements, which are worded in a manner suggesting that the Commission would be obliged to conduct negotiations "in continuous coordination and permanent dialogue with the Council and its preparatory bodies". However, there is no obligation for the Commission to consult or inform the Council and Coreper separately from and in addition to the special committee designated in accordance with Article 218(4) TFEU. The Commission considers that points 69 and 70 of the negotiating directives are in this respect at odds with Article 3 of the Council Decision and with the requirements of Article 218(4) TFEU."

#### Joint statement by Czechia, France and Germany

"Czechia, France and Germany abstain from the vote on the Council recommendation to the accession by Georgia to the Hague Convention of 1965 on the Service Abroad of Judicial and Extrajudicial Documents in Civil or Commercial Matters (hereafter the "Hague Service Convention").

Czechia, France and Germany have remaining doubts whether a recommendation for a line to be taken by the Council of the European Union with regard to the accession by Georgia to this convention as laid down in Documents 11969/21 and 12284/21 JUSTCIV is necessary and correct. It implicitly states that the European Union has exclusive external competence in this field of law, which is doubtful at least in the light of the discussions within the Council.

It is therefore important that a Council recommendation is limited to the matters that may affect common rules or alter their scope and where the EU has external competences already accepted by the Member States, which is not the case for the current text.

Czechia, France and Germany do not consider this recommendation as a precedent for any other accessions to the Hague Service Convention and other measures of the European Union that aim to regulate comparable subject matters, where exclusive external competence of the European Union could play a role but has not yet been agreed upon by the Member States."
