#### **INTRODUCTION**

The present transfer is a final fine-tuning exercise aiming at reallocating appropriations to the Commission priority needs, thus making the best use of the authorised appropriations. It takes into account the well-advanced state of implementation of the 2021 administrative budget.

Movements of appropriations aim in particular at:

Reinforcing the IT security and cybersecurity posture (EUR 11,6 million)

The investments on new or existing systems and services will first cover updated needs on the security field, in particular on cybersecurity. A total of EUR 6,7 million are direct investments on security activities or cybersecurity systems, and additional EUR 4,9 million aim at modernising the Commission IT systems portfolio, including decommissioning older systems, with a view to reduce the exposure to cyber threats and security risks in general.

Other IT investments (EUR 9,4 million)

The Covid-19 pandemic has brought complex challenges that IT should help to solve in particular through further digitalisation of processes to support the new ways of working which are characterised by a decentralised and paperless environment. The requested reinforcement of the IT budget lines will accelerate the response to the business needs, under a strong governance framework, which promotes efficiency by reusing existing systems or purchasing existing solutions from the market.

The following table summarises the reinforcements of IT by budget line and objective. More details appear under each reinforced budget line.

Reinforcing the buildings budget line (EUR 3,1 million)

The proposed reinforcement will allow the reimbursement of the outstanding repayments for certain 'Houses of Europe' in Member States, in line with the policy for their joint financing by the European Parliament and the Commission.

These essential reinforcements can be made in the light of the revised budget needs due to the Covid-19 crisis in respect of missions, conferences, committees, and training appropriations.

#### d) Detailed grounds for the increase

In order to maximise the impact of communication and presenting the EU in a coherent brand, the European Parliament and the European Commission have been working together for decades in the Member States. In most of them, European Parliament Liaison Offices (EPLOs) and Commission Representations have been sharing premises in "Houses of Europe".

The 2005 Communication on "An inter-institutional policy for offices of the Representations in the European Union" and its 2008 amendment made the case for a purchasing strategy. The Institutions acquired buildings hosting the Houses of Europe in Budapest, Copenhagen, La Valletta, Nicosia, Sofia, The Hague and Vienna.

In the case of Sofia and Vienna, the Parliament paid the full price of the acquisition and the Commission is reimbursing its part over time in yearly instalments. These two cities are the only ones that have outstanding payments. The proposed reinforcement of EUR 3,1 million would allow the outstanding amount in Sofia to be reimbursed in full, and would cover around 3 years of instalments in Vienna.

Most of this reinforcement will satisfy the needs that could not be covered with the initial 2021 budget and the previous transfer in favour of IT lines (DEC 14/2021). Close to EUR 3 million will directly reinforce the Commission (and EU Institutions) IT security and cybersecurity systems (for example EU Login and EU Access, inter-institutional exchange of certificates, identity governance).

An additional EUR 3,5 million will indirectly reinforce security and cybersecurity by investing on standard and generalised corporate solutions and strengthened IT governance (for example the Reusable Solutions Platform, integration with ready-made market solutions, reinforcement of reference and corporate architecture).

Finally a total of EUR 5,9 million will be devoted to the update and adaptation to the new ways of working of existing or new standard systems across the Commission (for example corporate accounting and financial platform SUMMA, corporate decision making processes DECIDE, corporate information on internal control systems CENTRICS).

Some EUR 3,8 million are to be invested in direct security and cybersecurity components. These will reinforce the hardware, software, licences and services available to the Commission corporate Data Centre (for example hardware upgrades and fast storage to support the Development, Security and Operations practices; penetration testing; assessment, preparation and training for the upcoming internal security regulation; upgrading the methodology for the risk assessments and IT security plans of information systems).

Another EUR 0,6 million will indirectly enhance IT security through a total automation and homogenisation in the access to Data Centre assets (hardware and software).

Finally, EUR 2 million will reinforce horizontal services in the Data Centre to improve the adaptation of the IT delivery to the business needs (for example the Service Now platform that will get the maximum synergies of using the same product for different use cases; support of the multi-annual planning and programming initiative).
