### **Statement by the Commission**

"By its judgement in joined cases C-103/12 and C-165/12 (European Parliament and the Commission v. Council) the Court of Justice clearly confirmed that decisions relating to the conclusion of external fisheries agreements fall fully within the scope of Article 43(2) TFEU (in conjunction with the applicable procedure of Article 218 TFEU, i.e. Article 218(6)(a)(v) for the decisions on the conclusion of the agreements) and rejected the position that such decisions could fall within the scope of Article 43(3) TFEU.

In relation to the decisions on the signing and provisional application as well as on the conclusion of the Protocol on the implementation of the Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the Democratic Republic of São Tomé e Príncipe and the European Community, the Commission regrets the Council's amendment replacing the substantive legal basis of Article 43(2) TFEU with Article 43 (without mentioning the paragraph), and therefore maintains its initial proposal."

### Déclaration de la France

"La France prend acte de la décision du Conseil de ce jour de ne pas s'opposer à l'adoption du projet de règlement (UE) de la Commission modifiant le règlement (UE) n° 546/2011 en ce qui concerne l'évaluation de l'impact des produits phytopharmaceutiques sur les abeilles communes. Comme indiqué dans sa proposition d'objection, la France considère que le document guide EFSA 2013 devrait être appliqué de façon plus complète comme cela avait initialement été proposé par la Commission. Ainsi, les modifications prévues par le règlement en objet sont insuffisantes par rapport aux objectifs de protection des pollinisateurs et les principes uniformes doivent refléter les méthodes d'évaluation et de décision les plus récentes et approfondies. La France s'est opposée à ce projet de règlement lors du comité permanent des 16 et 17 juillet et a proposé que le Conseil objecte à son adoption au titre de la procédure de réglementation avec contrôle, au motif qu'il n'est pas conforme aux objectifs du règlement (CE) n° 1107/2009, acte de base, pour des raisons impérieuses de protection des pollinisateurs au regard des connaissances scientifiques et techniques. La France regrette cette décision alors que le déclin des pollinisateurs est un enjeu majeur pour la protection de l'environnement mais également pour la production agricole."

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
