Status of methodology and praxis

- Engagement: To invite others to have influence on your own praxis
 - Different from "communicating", "convincing", "educating", "campaigning"
 - · Involves proper information, deliberation and messages "from them to you"
- Creates knowledge on informed opinion, expands the visionary room, increases societal relevance, involves and gives ownership to RTI and policy



FP7 Science in Society 2011-2015

- Methodology = Ability to select and adapt methods to the situation
- Methods = Procedures to follow to gain certain kinds of results
- Techniques = Interchangeable elements in methods


- Role of participants

- Global scan of methods
 - → 57 "mother methods" plus variants
- Selection system with most used criteria

Helps to get an idea of the relevant methods for a researcher

But, cannot make it up for a trained engagement practitioner



Case 1: Human Brain Project



10-year flagship project

From day 1: "Ethics and society / RRI" subproject: includes regular citizen consultations:

- Privacy in health research infrastructure → state of art privacy policy
- Dual Use and brain science → internal work group and policy brief for EU
- Al in science → awareness raising and policy recommendations
- Brain Disease Signatures (ongoing)

Lesson 1: Engagement expertise embedded in project organization

Lesson 2: Ability and flexibility to do the right thing at a given moment

Lesson 3: Internal (science) and external (policy) messages connected



Case 2: RUMIGEN

5-year ongoing project: New ruminant breeding approaches for climate, diversity and resilience


- "Room of acceptance" by SSH science and engagement experts
- Scenarios respecting the RoA developed with multiactors
- Check scenarios in EU-wide citizen engagement
- Feed results into final development and conclusions on new breeding guidelines

Summary 1

- 60+ methods and online methodology tool available
 - We do not lack engagement methods
- Methodology is complex demands expertise
 - · Methods can be executed after some training
- Engagement sits well as a core project strategy
 - Especially when projects are meant to influence the life of citizens



Challenges for missions

- First of all citizen engagement is demanded everywhere in the Missions
 WP (and elsewhere in HE). A big step-up from Horizon2020!!
- Some challenges can be identified, though
- May need to be taken care of to make Missions have the wished societal impact and wide ownership to solutions.



Science, innovation, policy and implementation combined




- For complex challenges, these two worlds have to be coupled
- Participatory, inclusive, dialogical approaches are those that can glue the knowledge and the policy trajectories together
- →Which channels for engagement to influence both?
- → Policy DGs and member states will need to open up policy development processes for citizen engagement



Channels for influence?

- What are the channels citizen engagement shall use?
- Not obvious that citizens can reach the policy actors




→Clear definition of channels (stronger than policy briefs.....)

→ Clear central responsibility for supporting the channels

When will engagement happen?



- Important to foresee the needed engagement between RTI and policy
- Very early (Open Research Agenda Setting) can provide bottom-up signals
- Conflicts come when engagement needs are pushed to the last policy phases
- →These are "engagement strategic" decisions who take them??
- →ORAS could be part of all Missions co-creating STI and policy agendas
- → Targeted engagement to be initiated from RTI as well as from policy



Engagement a core strategy?

- Engagement has strong potential as core strategy in Missions,
- but this seems not really implemented in the 2021 WP
- Strategically very differently placed in each Mission
- Topic-strong Pl's will lead most projects will engagement expertise be at core – or become providers of 'side-activities'?

- →Topic calls on core projects should demand an engagement strategy as part of the proposal
- →Core projects should hold methodology expertise in core team



Summary 2

- Missions need to have engagement initiated from the science as well as the policy side
- Missions need clear channels to policy especially for engagement outputs
- Engagement needs to be based on explicit strategy
 - In missions and in projects
- That demands methodology expertise in core teams
