| Subject: | COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU)/ of 17.12.2019 supplementing Regulation (EU) 2016/429 of the European Parliament and of the Council, as regards animal health requirements for movements within the Union of terrestrial animals and hatching eggs - Intention not to raise objections |

- On 17 December 2019, <u>the Commission</u> submitted the above delegated act to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with the second subparagraph of Article 3(5), Article 125(2), Article 131(1), Article 132(2), Article 135, Article 136(2), Article 137(2), Article 140, Article 144(1), Article 146(1), Article 147, Article 149(4), Article 154(1), Article 156(1), Article 160, Article 162(3) and (4), Article 163(5)(b) and (c) and Article 164(2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/429¹. <u>The Council</u> may object to it until 18 February 2020.
- During a silence consultation, <u>the Austrian delegation</u> indicated reasons that could be grounds for objecting to the delegated act.

 Consequently, <u>the Presidency</u> added the item on the agenda of the meeting of <u>the Working</u> <u>Party of Chief Veterinary Officers²</u> on 27-28 January 2020 for discussion. At that meeting, <u>the</u> <u>Presidency</u> noted that there was no qualified majority in favour of objecting to the act.

Furthermore, after considering the explanations given by the Commission representatives at that meeting, <u>the Austrian delegation</u> informed the Presidency that it would not object to the delegated act.

4. It is therefore suggested that <u>the Coreper</u> recommend that <u>the Council</u>, as an "A" item on the agenda of one of its forthcoming meetings, confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless <u>the European Parliament</u> objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 264(6) of Regulation (EU) 2016/429.
