The information is based on information provided by Member States to the General Secretariat of the Council, to which reference is made in the last column.

In accordance with Article 34(1), the Framework Decision should have been implemented by 31 December 2003. According to the information received, all Member States have implemented the Framework Decision in their national legal order and have made the necessary notifications/declarations.

Please note that the information in the table is a summary of the information received: delegations are invited to consult the documents referred to in the last column, in order to obtain more detailed information.

The information provided in the table is up-to-date as at 19 February 2025. Changes made in this version concern Germany, relating to notifications under Articles 6(3) and 7(2).
