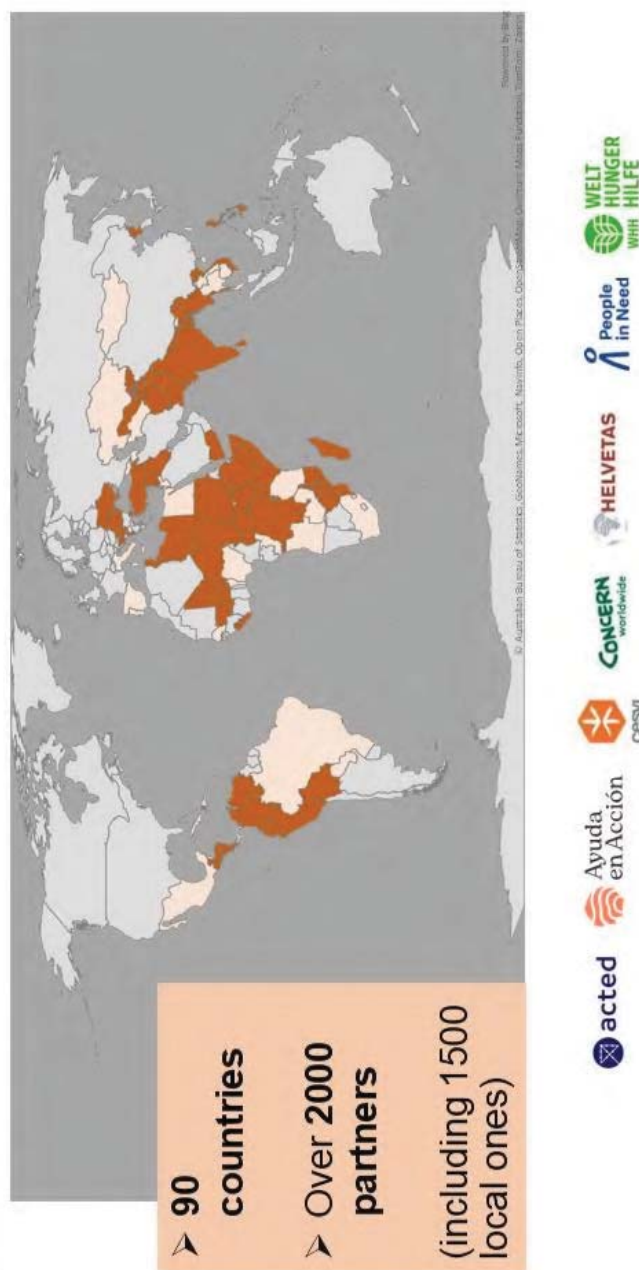

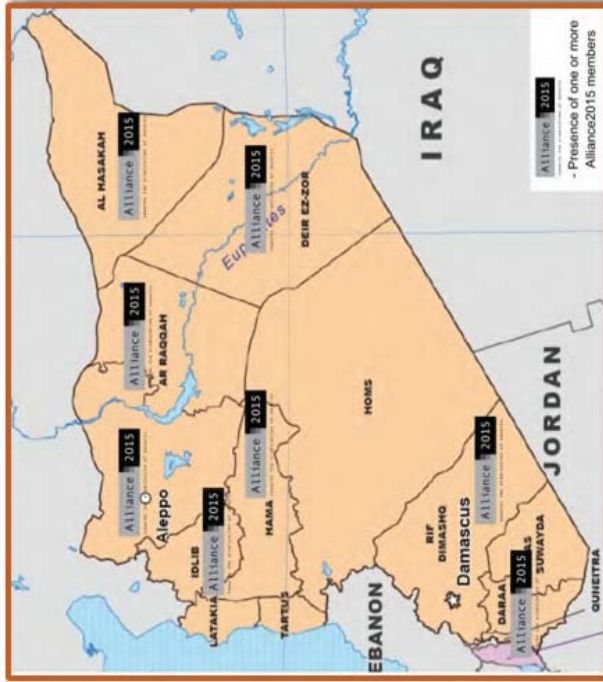

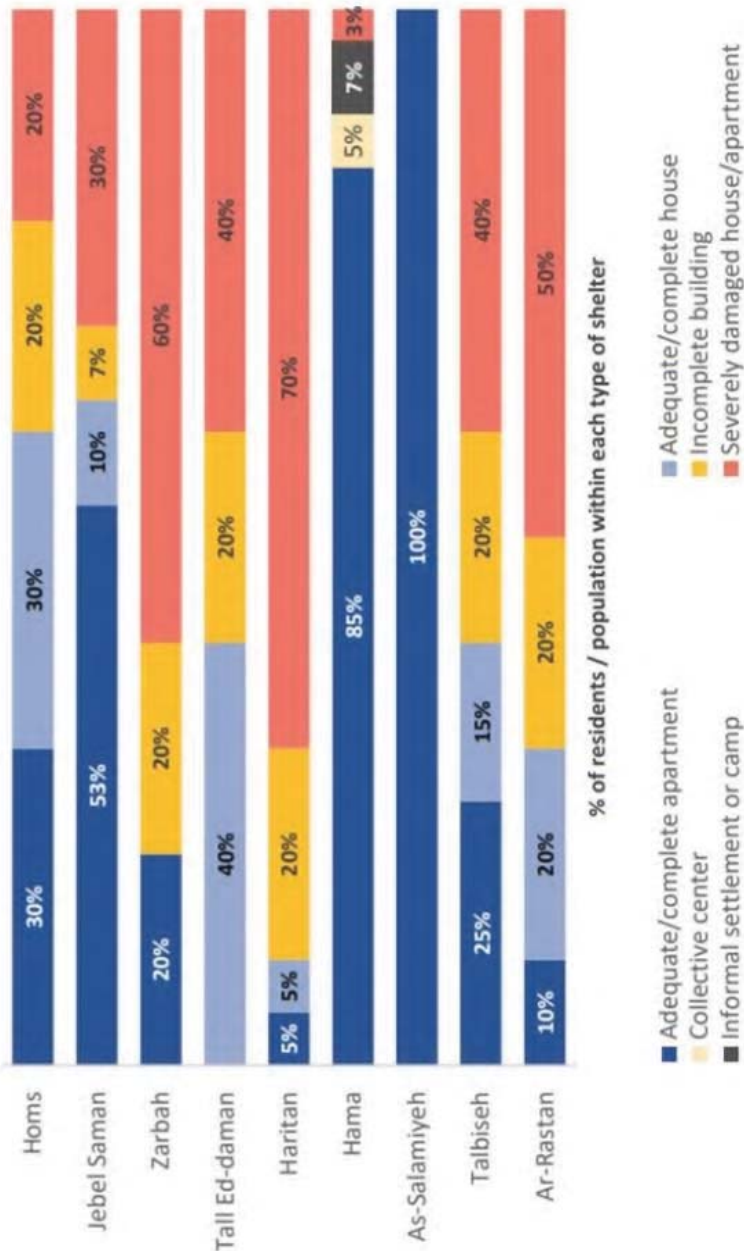

- National and local Government Systems not fully in place -> challenges with registration

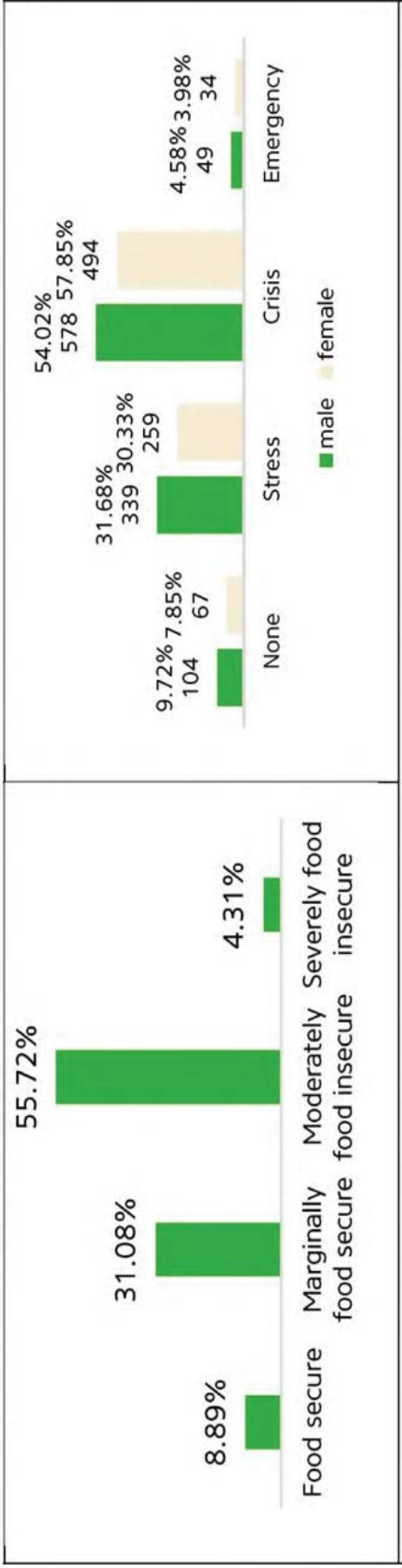
