Delegations are informed that the written procedure, opened by CM 2438/25 of 16 April 2025, was completed on 22 April 2025 at 12:00.

In relation to the Council decision on the position to be taken on behalf of the European Union within the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on the extension of the term for accession of Tunisia to the Council of Europe Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence, with regard to matters related to institutions and public administration of the Union as set out in document 7653/25, one delegation abstained and 19 delegations voted in favour of its adoption.

As per to Council decision on the position to be taken on behalf of the European Union within the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on the extension of the term for accession of Tunisia to the Council of Europe Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence, with regard to matters related to judicial cooperation in criminal matters, asylum and non-refoulement as set out in document 7649/25, one delegation abstained and 17 delegations voted in favour of its adoption.

The required qualified majority has been reached for both Council decisions. Therefore, the above Council Decisions are adopted and will be published in the Official Journal.
