Subject:	AOB for the meeting of the Transport, Telecommunications and Energy Council on 6 June 2025 : Global Partnership on AI Summit (Bratislava, 25-26 November 2025) - Information from Slovakia

Slovakia will be hosting the GPAI Summit, following successful completion of the procedures in GPAI and OECD, on 25-26 November 2025 in Bratislava. The summit will be held under the broad theme "Putting the Partnership into action: expanding international and multistakeholder cooperation across GPAI countries and stakeholders".

The GPAI Summit will include a GPAI Council meeting at the ministerial level. A Ministerial Bureau comprised of the 2025 GPAI co-chairs (Serbia and Slovak Republic) will support Summit preparations, including advising on organizational aspects and substantive input. A draft "Bratislava Declaration" will be developed for adoption by Ministers at the GPAI Council meeting. The Declaration will welcome recent GPAI outputs and provide high-level orientations for GPAI's work in 2026.

The Summit will focus on several key thematic areas across its two-day program. On the first day, discussions will centre on understanding and shaping the future of AI, exploring current and future AI capabilities. Sessions will address critical infrastructure needs, including AI compute power, energy requirements, and cooling solutions. Participants will also examine foundational inputs for AI ecosystems, such as data resources, models, algorithms, and open-source considerations.

The second day will feature discussions on mobilizing investment in AI, with insights on measuring AI investment trends. Sessions will address approaches to ensure safe and secure AI throughout its lifecycle, including presentations on the GPAI Safety and Assurance of Generative AI project and the AI Incidents Monitor. The Summit will explore how to share AI benefits widely across different regions and development levels, with special emphasis on emerging and developing countries. Specialized sessions will focus on AI applications in agriculture and the impact of AI on labour markets and professions.

The final agenda is expected to evolve in the run up to the summit.

This Summit represents an important opportunity for GPAI Ministers to come together, reflect on GPAI's accomplishments, discuss key AI developments, advance global collaboration, and provide direction for future work.
