Updates to Commission proposal for a Council Regulation fixing the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks and groups of fish stocks applicable in the Baltic Sea for 2026 and amending Regulation (EU) 2025/202 as regards certain fishing opportunities in other waters (COM (2025) 458 final)

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1. Amendments in relation to Norway pout

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Council Regulation (EU) 2025/202¹ fixes total allowable catches ('TACs') for Norway pout (*Trisopterus esmarkii*) in: (i) International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) division 3a (Skagerrak-Kattegat); and (ii) United Kingdom and Union waters of ICES subarea 4 and United Kingdom waters of ICES division 2a (North Sea), for the period from 1 November 2025 to 31 October 2026.

Norway pout in those areas is a stock jointly managed with the United Kingdom, listed in Annex 35 of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community, of the one part, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the other part ('TCA')². For that TAC, the fishing season runs from 1 November to 31 October of the following year. On 10 October 2025, ICES published its advice for Norway pout in ICES subarea 4 and division 3a for the upcoming fishing season³ and according to the advice, the catches from 1 November 2025 to 31 October 2026 should be zero tonnes.

On 20 October 2025, the Union and the United Kingdom held bilateral consultations on the level of that TAC for the period from 1 November 2025 to 31 October 2026, pursuant to Article 498(2) of the TCA. The Union participated in those consultations on the basis of specifications to the Union position endorsed by the Council on 14 October 2025, pursuant to Article 2 of Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875⁴.

The Union and the United Kingdom noted the ICES zero-catch advice for that stock for the period from 1 November 2025 to 31 October 2026. However, they also noted that if the TAC for Norway pout were set at zero, the obligation to land all catches, including by-catches from that stock in mixed fisheries, would give rise to the phenomenon of 'choke species'⁵ in the fisheries targeting cod, haddock, whiting and herring in ICES zones 2a, 3a and 4. The Union and the United Kingdom, therefore, agreed to set a by-catch TAC for Norway pout in the Skagerrak-Kattegat and in the North Sea for those other fisheries targeting cod, haddock, whiting and herring at the level of 400 tonnes. That level approximately corresponds to the levels of recent unavoidable by-catches in those other fisheries. That outcome was documented in the Written Record of fisheries consultations, signed by the Heads of Delegation of the Union and the United Kingdom on 24 October 2025.

It is therefore proposed to implement the outcome of those consultations in Union law by setting a by-catch TAC for Norway pout in the Skagerrak-Kattegat and the North Sea for the period from 1

November 2025 to 31 October 2026, pursuant to Article 16(4) of Regulation (EU) No 1380/2013⁶, in conjunction with Article 2(1) and (5), points (c) and (f), of that Regulation.

AMENDMENTS TO THE RECITALS

Recital (20) is replaced by the following:

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- (20) The Union and the United Kingdom held bilateral consultations on 20 October 2025 on the TAC for Norway pout in ICES division 3a (Skagerrak-Kattegat), United Kingdom and Union waters of ICES subarea 4 and United Kingdom waters of ICES division 2a (North Sea) for the period from 1 November 2025 until 31 October 2026. Those consultations were held pursuant to Article 498(2) of the Trade and Cooperation Agreement between the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community, of the one part, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the other part ('TCA')⁷. The Union participated in those consultations on the basis of specifications to the Union position endorsed by the Council on 14 October 2025, pursuant to Article 2 of Council Decision (EU) 2021/1875⁸. The Union and the United Kingdom agreed on a TAC based on the ICES advice for Norway pout in in ICES subarea 4 and division 3a for that period published on 10 October 2025. The outcome of the consultation was documented in the Written Record, which was signed by the Heads of Delegation of the Union and the United Kingdom on 24 October 2025. The TAC for the period from 1 November 2025 to 31 October 2026 should therefore be fixed at the level set out in that Written Record.
