#### STATEMENT BY POLAND

"Poland considers that the solutions set out in the proposed Regulation are justified and have the expected added value. For this reason, and in the spirit of compromise, Poland supports the adoption of the draft Regulation.

However, in Poland's view the scope of the draft Regulation should be broader in order to fully address the problems identified when applying the existing provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/2031 of the European Parliament of the Council of 26 October 2016 on protective measures against pests of plants. In Poland's view, it is possible to further reduce the burden on administrations and operators without increasing the phytosanitary risk.

The draft Regulation has not fully eliminated the issue of the unworkable recommendations made to Poland (DG (SANTE) 2021-7273) regarding notification in the TRACES system of the results of inspections of wood packaging used for the transport of goods not subject to border phytosanitary checks, which are conducted outside the phytosanitary border control posts. Such notifications are not possible in view of the way the TRACES system functions. Poland therefore expects the European Commission to urgently resolve this issue by means of non-legislative measures.

Poland also expects the European Commission to urgently put forward a legislative initiative exercising its delegated power to define derogations from the obligation to issue plant passports for certain goods in the case of sales through distance contracts."
