## **Updates to Commission proposal for a Council Regulation fixing for 2025 and 2026 the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks, applicable in Union waters and, for Union fishing vessels, in certain non-Union waters [COM(2024) 506 final]**

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## 1. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO RED SEABREAM IN ATLANTIC IBERIAN WATERS

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

In the Commission proposal for a Council Regulation fixing the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks, applicable in Union waters and, for Union fishing vessels, in certain non-Union waters ('the Commission proposal'), as updated through the second Commission services non-paper of 23 November 2024<sup>1</sup>, it is proposed to set the total allowable catches (TAC) for red seabream in International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) subarea 9 (Atlantic Iberian waters) for 2025 and for 2026 in line with the ICES advice for red seabream distributed in ICES division 9a<sup>2</sup>, except for the Atlantic part of the Strait of Gibraltar (i.e. Galician and Portuguese coast). In addition, it is proposed to maintain the suspension of the fishery for red seabream in the Atlantic part of the Strait of Gibraltar, as adopted in October 2024, for 2025 and for 2026, in line with that ICES advice and the General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM) Scientific Advisory Committee on Fisheries (SAC) advice for red seabream distributed in GFCM geographical subareas 1 and 3 (western Mediterranean) and in the Atlantic part of the Strait of Gibraltar<sup>3</sup>.

Taking into account that: (i) the geographical scope of that TAC is ICES subarea 9; and (ii) the ICES advice notes that catches of the western Mediterranean and Strait of Gibraltar stock occur in ICES division 9a south of 36°10' N, the Commission services non-paper of 23 November 2024 included a suspension of the fishery for red seabream in ICES subarea 9 between that latitude and the southern boundary of ICES division 9a (i.e. 36° N). However, according to the GFCM<sup>4</sup>, catches of red seabream distributed in the western Mediterranean and the Atlantic part of the Strait of Gibraltar also occurred in 2023 south of the boundary between ICES subarea 9 and Committee for the Eastern Central Atlantic (CECAF) division 34.1.1, i.e. south of 36° N. Therefore, it is proposed also to suspend the fishery for red seabream in the adjacent EU waters of CECAF division 34.1.1 in 2025 and 2026 in order to ensure the protection of that stock in its entire distribution area in the Atlantic part of the Strait of Gibraltar, pursuant to Articles 1(3) and 8 of Regulation (EU) 2019/472 of the European Parliament and of the Council<sup>5</sup> ('Western Waters multiannual plan').

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## 2. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO SEAFO

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

At its 2024 annual meeting, the South East Atlantic Fisheries Organisation (SEAFO) adopted measures for stocks in the SEAFO Convention area, including the measures set out in the recital below. It is proposed to implement those measures in EU law.

### AMENDMENTS TO THE RECITALS

Recital (34) is replaced by the following:

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(34) At its 2024 annual meeting, the South East Atlantic Fisheries Organisation (SEAFO) maintained for the period 2025-2026 the TACs in the SEAFO Convention area set for 2024. However, the TAC of Patagonian toothfish (*Dissostichus eleginoides*) in SEAFO subarea D was increased by 13 tonnes for 2025 compared to 2024. Those measures should be implemented in Union law.

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### AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES

In Chapter III, Section 8, the square brackets are deleted.

### AMENDMENTS TO THE ANNEXES

Annex IE is replaced by the following:

#### SEAFO CONVENTION AREA

The TACs set out in this Annex are not allocated to the Contracting Parties of SEAFO and hence the Union’s share is undetermined. Catches are monitored by the SEAFO Secretariat which will communicate to the SEAFO Contracting Parties when fishing is to be ceased due to a TAC exhaustion.
