The undersigned **DELETED** as an Italian citizen and citizen of the European Union,

Having regard to

- Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 30 May 2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents, and
- the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, in particular Articles 41 (good administration) and 42 (access to documents);

Requests access

to a digital certified copy of the following documentation:

- all documents, communications and text messages (SMS, iMessage, WhatsApp, Signal or similar) exchanged by the Council, or its officials, with other EU institutions or agencies, with the governments and/or institutions of EU Member States and non-EU countries, citizens, and natural or legal persons, concerning sanctions applied by the United States of America to judges and prosecutors of the International Criminal Court established by the Rome Statute, as well as UN special rapporteurs;
- any intervention measures taken by the Council to protect individuals, whether citizens of the Union or not, who, in their capacity as public officials and in the performance of their duties, have been subject to sanctions or retaliatory measures by the United States of America.

It should be noted that this request concerns both documents drawn up by the Council and documents it holds of the abovementioned nature received from third parties.

These documents contain meeting reports and agendas of the Council Working Party on Public International Law (International Criminal Court) (COJUR-ICC). The documents include interventions by high-level representatives of the International Criminal Court (ICC) and discussions between representatives of the ICC and the Council's COJUR-ICC Working Party.

The General Secretariat of the Council (GSC) considers that the documents fall within the scope of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation No 1049/2001 (protection of international relations). There is a reasonably foreseeable and not purely hypothetical risk that disclosure of the documents could have a negative impact on the Union's international relations with both the ICC and the United States.

In addition, documents WK 2199/2025 INIT, WK 977/2025 REV 2, WK 16330/2024 INIT, WK 13800/2024 INIT, WK 9767/2024 INIT, WK 10658/2024 REV 2 contain personal data that fall within the exception set out in Article 4(1)(b) (protection of personal data) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001.

In view of the above, the GSC must refuse access to documents WK 5207/2026 INIT, WK 570/2026 INIT, WK 1474/2026 INIT, WK 14112/2025 INIT, WK 8959/2025 INIT, WK 2769/2025 INIT, WK 977/2025 REV 2, WK 2199/2025 INIT, WK 16330/2024 INIT, WK 15085/2024 INIT, WK 14446/2024 REV 1, WK 14446/2024 INIT, WK 14474/2024 INIT, WK 13800/2024 INIT, WK 9767/2024 INIT and WK 10658/2024 REV 2.

Documents WK 14967/2025 REV 1, WK 9119/2024 INIT, WK 9282/2024 REV 1, WK 8800/2025 REV 2:

These documents contain unpublished draft EU statements and positions that the EU may publicly adopt regarding US sanctions against members of the ICC, and include the deliberations of the Council's COJUR-ICC Working Party.

The GSC considers that the documents fall within the scope of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation No 1049/2001 (protection of international relations). There is a reasonably foreseeable and not purely hypothetical risk that disclosure of the documents could have a negative impact on the Unions' international relations with both the ICC and the United States.

In addition, document WK 14967/2025 REV 1 contains personal data that fall within the exception set out in Article 4(1)(b) (protection of personal data) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001.

In view of the above, the GSC must refuse access to documents WK 14967/2025 REV 1, WK 9119/2024 INIT, WK 9282/2024 REV 1 and WK 8800/2025 REV 2.

Documents WK 17056/2025 INIT, WK 16012/2025, WK 13896/2025 REV 2, WK 7934/2025 INIT, WK 1620/2026 INIT, WK 3152/2026 INIT:

These documents contain discussions and assessments carried out by the Council Working Party on Public International Law (COJUR) regarding US sanctions against members of the ICC.

The GSC considers that the documents fall within the scope of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation No 1049/2001 (protection of international relations). There is a reasonably foreseeable and not purely hypothetical risk that disclosure of the documents could have a negative impact on the Unions' international relations with both the ICC and the United States.

In view of the above, the GSC must refuse access to documents WK 17056/2025 INIT, WK 16012/2025, WK 13896/2025 REV 2, WK 7934/2025 INIT, WK 1620/2026 INIT and WK 3152/2026 INIT.

Documents ST 6761/26, ST 15131/25, ST 13459/25, ST 9987/25:

These documents contain exchanges and discussions between Member States' delegations regarding US sanctions against members of the ICC.

The GSC considers that the documents fall within the scope of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation No 1049/2001 (protection of international relations). There is a reasonably foreseeable and not purely hypothetical risk that disclosure of the documents could have a negative impact on the Unions' international relations with both the ICC and the United States.

In addition, document ST 9987/25 contains personal data that fall within the exception set out in Article 4(1)(b) (protection of personal data) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001.

In view of the above, the GSC must refuse access to documents ST 6761/26, ST 15131/25, ST 13459/25 and ST 9987/25.

Partial access

We have also examined the possibility of disclosing parts of the documents (Article 4(6) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001). However, since the exceptions to the right of access apply to the entirety of the content of the documents, the General Secretariat is unable to grant partial access.

Pursuant to Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, you may ask the Council to review this decision within 15 working days of receiving this reply. Should you consider such a review necessary, please state the reasons for your request.
