DRAFT DECISION OF THE EEA JOINT COMMITTEE

DECISION OF THE EEA JOINT COMMITTEE

amending Annex IV (Energy) to the EEA Agreement

THE EEA JOINT COMMITTEE,

Having regard to the Agreement on the European Economic Area (“the EEA Agreement”), and in particular Article 98 thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Commission Regulation (EU) 2017/460 of 16 March 2017 establishing a network code on harmonised transmission tariff structures for gas¹ is to be incorporated into the EEA Agreement.
- (2) According to Decision of the EEA Joint Committee No 93/2017 of 5 May 2017², Iceland has a derogation from Regulation (EC) No 715/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council, which is the legal basis for Regulation (EU) 2017/460. Therefore, Regulation (EU) 2017/460 should not apply to Iceland.
- (3) Article 2(2) of Regulation (EU) 2017/460 foresees that the Regulation shall not apply in Member States which have a derogation on the basis of Article 49 of Directive 2009/73/EC. In accordance with Directive 2009/73/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council, as incorporated into the EEA Agreement by Decision of the EEA Joint Committee No 93/2017 of 5 May 2017³, such a derogation applies to Liechtenstein. Therefore, Regulation (EU) 2017/460 should not apply to Liechtenstein.
- (4) There is no gas transmission network in Norway subject to the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 715/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 July 2009 on conditions for access to the natural gas transmission networks and repealing Regulation (EC) No 1775/2005⁴. Therefore, Regulation (EU) 2017/460 should be incorporated into the EEA Agreement and transposed in national law, but application should be suspended until an operational gas transmission network is in place in Norway. When an operational gas transmission network is in place, Norway should notify the EFTA Surveillance Authority accordingly.
- (5) As Regulation (EU) 2017/460 has been adopted on the basis of Regulation (EC) No 715/2009, the adaptation texts elaborated and adopted under Decision of the EEA

Joint Committee No 93/2017 of 5 May 2017⁵, incorporating Regulation (EC) No 715/2009 into the EEA Agreement, are relevant for the application of Regulation (EU) 2017/460.

(6) Annex IV to the EEA Agreement should therefore be amended accordingly,
HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The following point is inserted after point 50 (Commission Regulation (EU) 2017/459) of Annex IV to the EEA Agreement:

’51. **32017 R 0460:** Commission Regulation (EU) 2017/460 of 16 March 2017 establishing a network code on harmonised transmission tariff structures for gas (OJ L 72, 17.3.2017, p. 29-56).

The provisions of the Regulation shall, for the purposes of this Agreement, be read with the following adaptation:

Norway may suspend the implementation of the Regulation until a gas transmission network starts operating on its territory. Norway shall notify the EFTA Surveillance Authority when a gas network is in place.

The Regulation shall not apply to Iceland and Liechtenstein.’

Article 2

The text of Commission Regulation (EU) 2017/460 in the Icelandic and Norwegian languages, to be published in the EEA Supplement to the *Official Journal of the European Union*, shall be authentic.

Article 3

This Decision shall enter into force on [...], provided that all the notifications under Article 103(1) of the EEA Agreement have been made*.

Article 4

This Decision shall be published in the EEA Section of, and in the EEA Supplement to, the *Official Journal of the European Union*.
