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

<sup>1</sup> To ensure reliable poverty estimates, countries are required to have survey-based poverty data conducted within three years of the reference year, and IDA estimates are only provided if they cover at least 50 percent of the population in IDA countries. In addition, for 2020, 2021, and 2022, surveys before 2020 are not counted, such that post-2019 only years with sufficient data during or post-COVID have aggregates reported. The reason is that during the COVID-19 pandemic, countries experienced economic shocks and volatility at an unprecedented scale, which means that extrapolations from pre-COVID surveys may be less reliable.
