## Representative democracy and climate change

#### Multiple crises of representative democracy

- The erosion of traditional party systems (Berman 2018, Mudge 2018)
- The rise of xenophobic, racist, or authoritarian populist parties challenging liberal democracy (Mudde 2017)
- Depoliticization and polarization (McCoy et al. 2018)
- Declining support for democracy, increasing levels of political disenchantment, feelings of "non-ownership" (Lafont et al. 2021)
- Poor political representation of the poor (Schäfer and Elsässer 2018)

#### Problems of representative democracy in face of climate change

- Lack of specialized knowledge
- Oligarchization and responsiveness to particular non-climate-friendly interest
- Myopia and presentism (Smith 2021)






Figure 1. The parliamentary ecosystem

## **Epistocratic perspective: Climate advisory bodies**






Figure 1. The parliamentary ecosystem
